

The Foundation of Strong Instruction

- Align plans with state and national standards
- Use backward design (start with the end in mind)
- Integrate content areas to strengthen comprehension



Today's Classroom Realities



Classrooms reflect a wide range of backgrounds, experiences, and skill levels



Recognize student strengths and prior knowledge



Aim for full student access and engagement in all subject areas

The Unit Planning Process

1

Step 1: Identify academic standards and learning goals

2

Step 2: Conduct a needs assessment (pre-tests, surveys, KWL charts)

3

Step 3: Choose meaningful themes connected to real-world relevance

4

Step 4: Involve families early with a unit welcome letter or kickoff event

Designing Daily Instruction

- Tailor instruction to meet different learning needs:
 - Vary content, process, and product
 - Adapt classroom setup and grouping formats
- Focus on clear, measurable objectives for both content and language

Use various methods: visuals, hands-on activities, Use movement Apply multiple intelligences: Apply • Verbal, logical, spatial, kinesthetic, musical, interpersonal, intrapersonal, naturalist Blend traditional instruction with modern tools for Blend greater impact Support Support instruction with technology

Multiple Ways to Reach Students


Building Motivation Through Choice

- Encourage participation by offering assignment options
- Examples: Poster, video, oral presentation, model, written report
- Let students showcase strengths while meeting academic objectives



Language Support Strategies

- Teach key vocabulary before lessons using pictures and student-friendly definitions
- Use the WIDA Can Do Descriptors and Language Expectations
- Embed speaking, listening, reading, and writing opportunities in each lesson
- Teach academic vocabulary as well as content vocabulary



Assessment Throughout the Unit

- Formative assessments: Exit tickets, observations, class discussions
- Summative assessments: Projects, presentations, tests
- Self-reflection: Encourage students to evaluate their learning and set goals
- Provide feedback regularly and constructively
- Content objectives (specific and measurable) are reflected in the assessment(s).



Lesson Plan Components

- Hook: Activate curiosity and prior knowledge
- Content objectives: Specific, measurable, and tied to standards
- Language objectives: Enable students to access academic content
- Teaching strategies: Model, guide, and check for understanding
- **Student activities:** Promote thinking, interaction, and real-world application





Supporting All Students

- Make instruction accessible with:
 - Extra time, sentence frames, visual aids
 - Modified text, bilingual support, peer help
- Work with ESOL specialists to ensure each student moves toward grade-level goals

Use technology to personalize instruction and track progress

Professional Growth and Teamwork

- Participate in training sessions focused on instruction and lesson design
- Co-plan with colleagues and share strategies
- Use shared planning time to align goals, pacing, and supports



Reflection and Revision

After teaching a unit:

- What worked? What didn't?
- Review student work, feedback, and outcomes

Adjust lessons based on student progress and evolving standards



Families and Community as Partners

- Encourage home participation with newsletters, events, and family check-ins
- Use community resources to enrich instruction (e.g., field trips, guest speakers)
- Simple connections build trust and strengthen student success
